The aim of the tournament is to give the top players in the area competition of a high standard and to give the spectators in the Exeter area the opportunity of seeing what good class volleyball is all about since it really came to prominence during the Olympic Games.

"The reaction of many people who watched volley ball on television during the Olympics is that it is a tremendous spectator sport.

'Now these people have a chance to see this type of voileyball," added Mr. Reynolds.

There will be admission by programme, and these are available from the C.C.P.R., in Crewkerne.
