Newcomers take control by starting with three victories

Wanderers took the first two sets 25-22, Prior rallied to win the third before Andy Nicks, Steve Raine and Glen Tom dominated the fourth for the eventual winners.

Thunder have also beaten Friends Provident Queens 4-1, with key 25-23 and 25-22 wins in the third and fourth sets.

Debbie Chalk's consistent serving was the feature of Thunder's 5-0 win against FP Wander Women.


 National League side Torexe were looking for major improvements this weekend after going down to their third defeat in five outings at the Riverside last weekend.
